[Designate a station to log check-ins if you cannot do it yourself.]

[A few minutes before the net, contact the person who runs the "Wednesday report" to see if there will be one. Note which one (usually AR Newsline, but could be something else.]

Good evening. My name is *[NAME]*, my call is *[CALL]*, and I am Net Control Operator for the York Radio Club's 70-centimeter weekly Traffic and Information Net. The net meets every Wednesday evening at 8:00 PM local time on this frequency, 442.875 MHz, with the standard repeater offset of plus 5 MHz, and a PL tone of 114.8 Hz. We operate under our club call, W9YRC. All check-ins are welcome.

If any station has emergency or priority traffic, please call Net Control now – emergency or priority traffic ONLY. *[PAUSE FOR TRAFFIC]*

This net is a <u>Directed Net</u>. Please channel all communications through net control.

Our Net has three **[or if there's a Wednesday report: four]** Segments:

- A Traffic & Information Segment
- A Swap & Shop Segment
- A Tech Segment for any questions or requests for information you may have.
- [If there there's a Wednesday report:] A broadcast of this week's [Amateur Radio Newsline/or other] report.

(if you will be asking a question - please insert your question and set-up here)

We now proceed to check-ins. Please state if you have traffic when you check in.

W9YRC begins by calling for any low power or mobile stations that may soon be out of range.

Low power or mobile stations only please. [PAUSE FOR AND ACKNOWLEDGE EACH CHECK-IN.]

We will now proceed with our regular check-ins.

[BEGIN CALLING THE ROLL. ACKNOWLEDGE EACH CHECK-IN. CALL STATIONS ONLY RECENT CHECKINS]

[KEEP AN EYE ON THE CLOCK. BE SURE TO IDENTIFY AS W9YRC EVERY 10 MINUTES.]

[AFTER COMPLETING THE ROLL:]

W9YRC now calls for any regular check-ins wishing to check-in late. [PAUSE FOR AND ACKNOWLEDGE EACH CHECK-IN.]

W9YRC now calls for any other amateur radio operators who are hearing our Net and would like to check in to please call now. [PAUSE FOR AND ACKNOWLEDGE EACH CHECK-IN.]

Proceeding to our Traffic Segment, W9YRC calls on *[CALL THE FIRST ON THE LIST]*. Please pass your traffic. *[CONTINUE UNTIL ALL TRAFFIC HAS BEEN PASSED.]*

Does anyone else have traffic to pass? [WAIT FOR RESPONSES.]

Does anyone have anything for Swap and Shop? [WAIT FOR RESPONSES.]

Does anyone have questions or requests for information? [WAIT FOR RESPONSES. Answer or ask for help answering the questions.]

[IF THERE IS A WEDNESDAY REPORT:] We now call on [name and call of the presenter] for the [report].

[WHEN THE REPORT IS DONE:] Thank you [name] for presenting that report. This is W9YRC [since it may be pushing 10 minutes since the last ID.]
